Staffing Changes

As we progress through the years we realize where we need to make modifications. We cannot stick with the idea of “that is how it has been done in the past.” We need to analyze the data and hypothesize the cause and effect relationships that lead to the progress that our students are making. We then need to devise what we consider to be the best course of action. Decisions are never made in haste or without careful reflection and discussion among the staff.

Instructional Consultant

Mrs. Rossi will fill a role that existed at CES in the past. Her experience and knowledge will support teachers in the classroom as an instructional consultant. This position will allow the teachers (who work in isolation often times due to the size of our school) to have another teacher to collaborate with on curriculum and assessment. This position is extremely important to our constant growth. She will also spend a portion of her day delivering Special Education services to some of our students.

School Psychologist

We are in the process of interviewing candidates for a full-time school psychologist. This change will afford the CES student population more consistency with support services that have previously been offered through a part time social worker and a part time psychologist. The new staff member will continue to carry out the same services offered every day of the week rather than a select few days. This person will also be an additional asset to a new program to the school as well as to students who need behavioral supports.

Middle Academy

We are in the process of interviewing for a new teacher to join the CES family. This teacher will join the fifth/sixth grade team and have an impact on the methods and strategies we choose to employ to reach our students in all curricular areas.

The goal is to strengthen the delivery of instruction and to help our students make bigger gains in all areas. The decision to place the teacher in this grade has been guided by our student needs and performance. The present third grade will combine into one class and the present fourth grade class will split into two sections.

- ◆ “under the right circumstances, groups are remarkably intelligent, and are often smarter than the smartest people in them.” (James Surowiecki)



Pre-K Readiness Program

I recently met with the parents of the children in our Pre-K Readiness Program to discuss the changes being made. The goal of the program is to prepare the children who will enter into Chaplin's kindergarten class. One of the goals of the Readiness program is to provide a language rich environment in which children learn a sense of self as a learner, a sense of responsibility to oneself and others, effective functioning as an individual and a member of a group.

In order for us to reach as many children in the community as we possibly can, we are in need of transitioning the program to two part-day readiness classes. We can then have greater impact on a larger number of three and four year olds.

We will run the AM session from 8:30 to 11:00 and the PM session from 12:45 to 3:15. The readiness team will use time in between the sessions to meet as a staff to discuss the needs of the children in the classes and to prepare for the children by collaborating in professional development sessions.

We are confident in the positive impacts the changes will have on more students entering Kindergarten!
