From there, we begin to stagger the grades as they take the Smarter Balanced Assessment and the NWEA. Please refer to the monthly calendar that is on the back side of the lunch calendar for specific grades, dates and tests. We will complete our testing in June as we only do portions of the assessments each week and build in make-up times.

Please take note of the days your child's class will be taking the assessments, and do your best to ensure that your child gets a good night's rest before and has a positive start to the morning! The NWEA assessments will help us in making final decisions about students who will be invited to participate in the CES Summer Learning Academy.

We will begin sending out the CES Summer Learning Academy invitations within the next few weeks. The purpose of the summer learning program is to extend the time many of our students need in order to master skills being worked on in their current grade. The instruction will help to maintain and sharpen many of skills and concepts presented throughout the school year. The SLA will run from July 5– August 5 on Mondays - Thursdays from 8:30-11:30.

Lastly, The CES Board of Education will vote on the final day of school for the children at the upcoming BOE meeting on May 12. Once this decision has been made, we will send a notice out to all our families.




Friendly Reminder for all Students and Families:

Dates may change slightly depending on the last day of school for the children.


Parent Survey
